Clarence T. Gilmour 1931 - 2011

Clarence Thomas Gilmour of Ivyland died on Friday, February 18 from complications of cancer.

Mr. Gilmour was born in Lashaska, PA to Clarence and Henrietta (Short) Gilmour. He attended elementary schools in New Hope and Ivyland, high school at Hatboro-Horsham, and college

at the University of Colorado graduating with a Bachelor's Degree in Mechanical Engineering. He worked for Pressure Products, in later years serving as their on-call engineer to various places in the U.S. and world wide.

He was a Staff Sergeant in the United States Air Force having served during the Korean War. He was recipient of the Air Force's Distinguished Flying Cross for his combat service.

In his younger years Clarence was an amateur Midget Car racer. Clarence loved to travel - Korea after the war, China, Peru and other South American countries. He was a member of Leman Memorial United Methodist Church where he enjoyed for many years serving as an usher.

Clarence is survived by his sister Marion Buck, her husband Donald Buck, and nieces Marianne Buck Flynn, Elizabeth Buck Rizzo, Samantha Williams Russell, and Tirzah Williams Carignan. He was pre-deceased by his sister Helen Williams.
