Oliver “Pete” Winter, of North Wales and former longtime resident of Horsham, died Saturday, September 3, in Neshaminy Manor. He was 86.

Pete was the beloved husband of Mae (Whitlock) Winter, with whom he had shared 65 years of marriage.

Born in Truxton, MO he was the son of the late Martin F. and Bertha Marie (Sievert) Winter.

During WW II, he served in the Merchant Marines. After the war, he
